

But as chairman I would like to thank Carey Smith for the hard and largely unsung work she has done for many years. I am pleased to welcome Pauline Smith who will be taking over her duties. Kev Smith has stepped down from his duties as Sunday Captain but will still be an integral part of the club.

Jon Burgess has unfortunately had to step down from the committee due work commitments, he will however continue to umpire as and when he can. I thank John for what he has done and welcome any help he might offer the club time permitting.

At the AGM the club invited Neil Forster to become its first president and also recognised the Smile Out Loud mastermind Nick Burridge by appointing him the club's first honorary life member.

Following fund raising, raiding the club's coffers and the phenomenal hard work by Caroline Dickenson on grant applications we now have a war chest of £16,000 with grant applications in for a further £9,200.

Our first account from no-less than the Captain's wife herself - Jo Harmer.

When James said he wanted to join the cricket team in Sherston I never realised how involved it would be for either of us.

I loved the idea of him being part of a team and taking part in something so gentlemanly and perhaps naively thought a few hours a week wouldn't be that intrusive.

Five years later and James is captain of the Saturday team and last year captained and initiated a Sherston indoor team on a Sunday during the winter – and yes I still married him.

Every year I feel more surprised that nets start so early – 'Really?! Already!?' and then it begins...

The cricket bag is removed from its happy hiding place in the shed and starts its regular appearance in the middle of the kitchen floor. It usually stays here from the weekend until about Wednesday when James can be persuaded to put it away again.

I honestly still have no idea why it needs to be so big, but really don't want to look inside it!

Then, during the week, start the cricket emails, phone calls, and texts. 'What you doing?' I say and comes the regular reply of 'getting a team together – I'm a player short!'

Last year I even started to suggest players so I must be getting the hang of it now.

During summer, we see a lot more of our Sherston friends and less of our more distant friends but some will visit and watch him play, or even get roped into playing as well.

However the 'few hours' I originally expected James to spend playing is more like at least 8 hours on a Saturday and of course as captain he can't possible not have a pint with the opposition...

It also occurs to me that just playing cricket every Saturday for the whole of summer isn't enough and in addition to the indoor league and the nets there are meetings.

I'm still not sure if 'cricket meeting' is code for 'beer at the pub' but apparently its necessary to have frequent get-togethers to discuss everything from the general running of the club to Magna Magic. 'Again!!!' is my frequent outburst!

Cricket really does take over sometimes, like when I came off the phone, very excited, massive smile, bit emotional back in October...

The 98-page book also contains beautiful illustrations by Neil Forster.


On both nights Nick read from a number of his poems including an explanation of his inspiration.

The evenings started with Nick reading his poem Dell Boy, penned after his experience when calling a computer helpline after his new computer died! This was followed by his amusing poem to D.O.R.I.S. (Digitally Operated Route Information System or SatNav) and other stories about modern life and tales from the Taj Mahal, the London Olympics, Royal Ascot and our very own Sherston!

Our club president, Neil Forster also kept the crowd enthralled with stories of his life as a foremost portrait artist.

He explained the approach he takes to capture not only the familiar physical appearance, but the personality of his subjects. He also included a moving story about his visit to see the gorillas of Rwanda in 1986.

There was always going to be an appearance by 'Dame' Kevin Smith but Kevin also performed as Arthur Shakespeare (William's lesser-known and very brummie brother), a Welsh outdoor-clothing salesman advising Ernest Shackleton, Guy Fawkes and Sherston's lesser-known 1016 hero Douglas Gee (could Nick's inspiration have been our very own Matty G?)

'I thought you all might like to know how a chance remark made to Nick Burridge to record his poems that he had written and used whilst he was Chairman of Sherston Probus Club to close our monthly meetings.

These embryo remarks also resulted in Neil Foster offering his artistic skills to illustrate the book. Members of Sherston Magna got to know Nick when he starting taking many photographs of players in action which were displayed as part of the Sherston Arts Festival. It was suggested that members formed a committee to work towards using the photographs and the book to assist fund raising for new practice and training facilities in Pinkney Park.'

The performances of Kevin Smith will remind many people of the evenings. Many thanks must go to Nick and Neil amply guided by the administration skills of James Kutchera, Tony Towle, John Burgess and of course the lady members of SMCC.'

The colour book was on sale for £14 and a black and white version for £9 (still available from the post office). The two evenings have so far raised a quite remarkable £5,200 towards Sherston Magna's new practice facilities. An enormous debt of gratitude is owed by the club to Nick Burridge for writing and putting on such a great show.






A great deal of thanks are also due Neil Forster and Kevin Smith for their part in a fantastic event.
